AN ORDINANCE DECLARING THE KEEPING OF LIVESTOCK
WITHIN THE TOWN OF MARKLEVILLE TO BE A NUISANCE,
AND PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF

WHEREAS, it is common knowledge that livestock confined in small enclosures cause noxious odors, noises, attract flies and vermin, become diseased, and contribute to the contamination of water and food. In closely populated areas, livestock is offensive to the senses, injurious to health, and interferes with the comfortable enjoyment of property.

NOW THEREFORE, Be it ordained by the Board of Trustees of the Town of Markleville:

Section 1: The keeping of livestock within the corporate limits of the Town of Markleville is hereby declared a nuisance.

Section 2: The term "livestock" shall mean swine, cattle, horses, sheep, goats, and the offspring of such animals. The term shall not include any single animal kept as a pet, so long as such pet is not dangerous to the inhabitants and citizens of the Town.

Section 3: Any person or persons owning any such livestock who shall knowingly keep the animals in the corporate limits of Markleville, or any person, persons, firms or corporations owning real estate, or having an interest therein, or any tenant in possession of any premises, who shall knowingly keep, or permit to be kept, any such livestock on his premises in the Town of Markleville shall be deemed in violation of this ordinance and guilty of a misdemeanor. Upon conviction thereof, such person, persons, firms or corporations so violating this ordinance, shall be fined in a sum of not less than One Dollar (\$1.00) nor more than Ten Dollars (\$10.00). Each day that such livestock is kept within the corporate limits of the Town shall be deemed a separate violation.

Section 4: In addition to the penalty provided for in Section 3 hereof, either the Town of Markleville, or any person whose property is injuriously affected or whose personal enjoyment is lessened by the nuisance, may bring an action in either the Circuit or Superior Courts of Madison County to abate any such nuisance.

Section 5: This ordinance shall take effect on the first day of July, 1964, and a copy shall be posted in one public place in each ward of the Town at least ten (10) days prior to the effective date hereof.

ORDINANCE NO. _____

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING TRAFFIC UPON THE PUBLIC
STREETS OF THE TOWN OF MARKLEVILLE, AND PROVIDING
A PENALTY FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF

BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Trustees of the Town
of Markleville in Madison County, in the State of Indiana:

SECTION 1: The following are designated through
streets within the corporation limits of the Town of
Markleville,

State Street
Maple Street
School Street
Cottage Avenue

SECTION 2: The driver of a vehicle shall come to a
complete stop at each entrance to State Street, and
at the entrance of Home Avenue to Maple Street. The
driver of a vehicle shall yield the right-of-way
at the entrance of Maple Street to School Street, and
the entrance of Cottage Avenue to Pleasant Run.

SECTION 3: Stop and yield signs shall be erected and
maintained at the entrances designated in Section 2
in conformity with Acts 1939, Ch. 48, Sec. 104, as
amended by Acts 1957, Ch. 290, Sec. 5.

SECTION 4: Nothing herein contained shall be construed
to conflict with the legal authority of the State
Highway Commission of Indiana to regulate traffic
on Main Street, which constitutes a part of State
Highway No. 38.

SECTION 5: Any person violating the provisions of this
ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon
conviction, shall be fined in a sum of not less than
one dollar nor more than ten dollars.

SECTION 6: This ordinance shall be in full force and
effect from and after its passage, the erection of the
stop and yield signs, and its publication or posting.

AN ORDINANCE TO CREATE A CUMULATIVE CAPITAL
IMPROVEMENT FUND


BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Trustees of the Town of Markleville:

SECTION 1: In accordance with the requirements of Section 8 of Chapter 225, Acts 1965 General Assembly, there is hereby created a special fund to be known as the Cumulative Capital Improvement Fund of Town of Markleville into which the cigarette taxes allotted to Town of Markleville by reason of subsection C (1) (C) of Section 27C and Section 27d of the Indiana Cigarette Tax Law being Chapter 222 of the Acts of 1947 as amended shall be deposited. Said fund shall be a cumulative fund and all of the monies deposited into said fund shall be appropriated and used solely for capital improvements as hereinafter defined and none of such monies shall revert to the general fund or be used for any purposes other than capital improvements.


SECTION 2: The term "capital improvements" means the construction or improvement of any property owned by the Town of Markleville including but not limited to streets, thoroughfares and sewers and the retirement of general obligation bonds of Town of Markleville issued, and the proceeds used for the purpose of constructing capital improvements. The term capital improvement shall not include salaries of any public officials or employees except those which are directly chargeable to a capital improvement.

SECTION 3: This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage.





That Section One of a Curfew Ordinance enacted on the 3 day of Sept, 1968 be amended in the following particulars:

- a. Insert 5:00 A.M. in place of 11:00 P.M. in Section One of the current Curfew Ordinance now in effect.

SECTION TWO:

That the amending ordinance and the ordinance proper shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Board of Trustees of the Town of Markleville, Indiana.

PARKING ORDINANCE

Be it ordained by the Town Board of the Town of Markleville, Indiana: That beginning on the 1st day of ^{June} April, 1968, parking is hereby restricted on the ~~west~~ ^{LEFT} side of State Street extending from the intersection of State Road # 38 South for a distance of 286 feet. Appropriate signs shall be placed by the Town Marshall in this area, and he shall be charged with the enforcement thereof and shall remove any vehicles violating this ordinance, and the owner shall be charged with said offense. The Town Marshall shall post a notice of this Ordinance in five public places in the Town of Markleville at least two weeks before the 4 day of JUNE, 1968. This ordinance

PARKING ORDINANCE

Be it ordained by the Town Board of the incorporated Town of Markleville, Madison County, Indiana,

Section 1 - Parking within the Town of Markleville, shall be restricted as follows: Proceeding from the intersection of North State Street, and State Road 38, North, on North State Street on the West side thereof 92 feet and on the East side thereof, 40 feet and then proceeding South on South State Street from the intersection with State Road 38, and South State Street, 180 feet South on the West side thereof and 165 feet on the East side thereof. Parking for the recited distances on North and South State Street shall be for a period of two hours from 8:00 A.M. to 5:00 P.M. daily Monday through Saturday only.

Section 2 - Whenever any Police Officer finds a vehicle standing upon the areas hereinabove set out, in violation of this ordinance, such officer is hereby authorized to move or cause to be moved such vehicle at the owner's expense, or to require the driver or other person in charge of the vehicle to, forthwith move the same.

Section 3 -- Any person who shall violate any of the provisions of this ordinance, shall, upon conviction thereof, be fined in a sum not exceeding ten (\$10.00) dollars.

Section 4 - This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect after its passage, according to law.
